

2018 FHE Senior Class Senior Biographies and Photos

Each senior will write a biographical sketch to be read by the Master of Ceremony as the graduate crosses the stage to receive his/her diploma. As the biography is read, a power point showing three photos of the senior will appear on the overhead screen. The photos typically include a baby/toddler photo, a middle school photo, and a senior photo. **A photo release form must accompany professional photos.**

Completed bios and photos should be **emailed to Diane Hansen** at treasureseeker@missionessentials.com. The bios may be sent separately from the photos, but if at all possible, please attach all 3 photos to one email. If photos need to be scanned in, you may email Diane Hansen to make arrangements.

Both bios and photos are due no later than February 4thth, 2018. There will be a drawing for a **\$20 gift card** for the graduate who submits their bio by the deadline and another **\$20 gift card** for graduate that submits their photos by the deadline! Drawings will be held at the February 11th meeting.

The biography may contain of **MAXIMUM of 70 words**. Please consider including some of these common elements, but it is not required to use all of these:

- Parents' names and number of years homeschooled
- Extracurricular activities, interests, roles of leadership, or volunteer work
- Church affiliation and activities
- Awards/Achievements/Accomplishments/Dual-Credit/College credit earned and/or scholarships earned
- Future plans and place (for example, missions with Cru; attending college at Calvary; completing trade school such as Z Hair academy; taking a gap year exploration trip to Mexico; manager roll at major restaurant; etc, etc.)
- Acknowledgements of people who have been important to you

IMPORTANT: If your name can be difficult to pronounce, please spell it out phonetically in parenthesis. For example, Rusbarsky would be written (Russ-bar-ski). This will save time and assure that it is pronounced correctly during graduation.
